




We use the Present Simple Tense when talking about things that happen regularly or facts that are always true.

PRESENT SIMPLE

✓ POSITIVE	NEGATIVE ✗	QUESTION ?
<p>I <u>sing</u>.</p> <p>He <u>sings</u>. She <u>sings</u>. It <u>sings</u>.</p> 	<p>I don't <u>sing</u>.</p> <p>He doesn't <u>sing</u>. She doesn't <u>sing</u>. It doesn't <u>sing</u>.</p> 	<p>Do I <u>sing</u>?</p> <p>Does he <u>sing</u>? Does she <u>sing</u>? Does it <u>sing</u>?</p> 

Make the sentences POSITIVE. ✓

- 1- She **PLAYS** football every day.
- 2- I **PLAY** football on Sundays.
- 3- He **LIVES** in Torrejón de Ardoz.
- 4- The cat **EATS** pizza.

Make the sentences NEGATIVE. ✗

- 1- She **DOESN'T PLAY** football every day.
- 2- I **DON'T PLAY** football on Sundays.
- 3- He **DOESN'T LIVE** in Torrejón de Ardoz.
- 4- The cat **DOESN'T EAT** pizza.

Ask QUESTIONS.

1- She / **play** / football ?

2- I / **play** / basketball ?

3- He / **live** / in Torrejón de Ardoz ?

Example: **Does she play** football?
